PRAMBLE: - The major thrust of the State Government's Industrial Policy is to encourage promotion and development of industries in the developing and backward regions of the State. A number of agencies are involved in the process of giving clearances/sanctions to new industries. Each of these agencies has, however, a specialised nature of work and the entrepreneur has to approach each of them separately to secure the requisite approvals. In order to accelerate the pace of implementation of the Government policy, it is considered expedient to streamline the system where clearances have to be given by different departments, agencies and Corporations which deal with sanctions for allotment of land, electricity, finance, etc., by bringing about a proper co-ordination among them. It has been keenly felt that in order to achieve this objective, it would be desirable to set up an independent organisation which would hopefully provide a better liaison between entrepreneurs on the one hand and the sanction giving agencies on the other. Government has already constituted District Industries Centres to co-ordinate and provide all facilities under one roof for Small Scale Industrial Units in the respective districts of the State. With a view to extending similar assistance to medium and large units in the developing areas of the State and to achieving proper co-ordination and issue of requisite sanctions/clearances speedily for the new industries coming up in the State, it is also considered necessary to establish such a new independent organisation.

RESOLUTION: - Government is accordingly pleased to constitute a High Power Co-ordination Committee with the following composition:-

- (1) The Chairman, State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra. ... Chairman
- (2) The Chairman, Maharashtra State Financial Corporation. ... Member
- (3) The Chairman, Maharashtra State Electricity Board. ... Member
- (4) The Chairman, Maharashtra Small Scale Industrial Development Corporation. ... Member
- (5) The Managing Director, State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra. ... Member
- (6) The Managing Director, Maharashtra State Financial Corporation. ... Member
- (7) The Managing Director, Maharashtra Small Scale Industrial Development Corporation. ... Member

- (8) The Chief Executive Officer, Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation. ... Member
- (9) The Industries Commissioner. ... Member
- (10) The Member-Secretary, Maharashtra Prevention of Water Pollution Board. ... Member

2. The main functions of the High Power Co-ordination Committee will be as follows:-

- (i) To receive Composite applications from the parties, after giving them full information regarding prospects of availability of infrastructure and raw materials for their projects;
- (ii) To convey to the applicant the prospects of approval after informally ascertaining the views of the departments/agencies concerned;
- (iii) To request and expedite the departments/agencies concerned to send their clearances within a stipulated period;
- (iv) To help the entrepreneurs to get final sanctions/allotment from the departments/agencies in case of direct application;
- (v) To suggest, on the basis of experience gained, suitable changes in policies and procedures to departments/agencies;
- (vi) To monitor the progress of implementation of industrial projects;
- (vii) To provide a data centre where information pertaining to land, water, power, finance and other assistance provided by the different agencies would be available;

3. The High Power Co-ordination Committee should meet on a fixed day/date of each month, to be specified by it, to review the progress of the cases. To assist the Committee, Government is pleased to direct that an operational unit consisting of representatives of various State-level promotional institutions like State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra, Maharashtra State Finance Corporation, Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation, Maharashtra State Electricity Board, etc. and the Directorate of Industries be constituted with immediate effect. This unit should be jointly owned by the State level organisations

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and the cost thereof shared by each of them equally. This operational unit should be called 'UDYOG MITRA' and it should perform the following functions:-

- (a) To provide assistance to entrepreneurs for submission of applications to different organisations; either through the High Power Co-ordination Committee or directly;
- (b) To provide assistance in following up such requests for appropriate sanctions from the concerned organisations;
- (c) To report to the High Power Co-ordination Committee the progress in respect of different cases, refer to it matters which may need clearances and convey such approvals/orders to the concerned parties;
- (d) To consider the feasibility and advisability of a common format of application for seeking assistance from different organisations;
- (e) To provide general guidance and all relevant information to entrepreneurs seeking to set up medium and large industries;
- (f) To establish a data centre to provide up-to-date information regarding availability of various facilities like land, water, power, finance, raw materials, licensing, registration, etc., to the intending entrepreneurs;
- (g) To attend to certain policy matters and basic problems of small scale industries, particularly with regard to ancillaries of medium/large scale industries, whenever referred to it, through a separate section to be started in course of time.

4. To start with, the UDYOG MITRA will consist of the following representatives of various Corporations and bodies:-

5. The UDYOG MITRA, in consultation with the High Power Co-ordination Committee, would in due course, decide on obtaining the services of officers from other organisations depending on the experience of working.

6. To start with, for the office of the UDYOG MITRA, a staff consisting of 2 stenographers, 1 Assistant and 1 Peon, on the scales and allowances applicable to State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra staff, should be sanctioned. Later on, further staff should be recruited by the Udyog Mitra in consultation with the High Power Co-ordination Committee.

7. The nominee officers and staff should be continued to be borne on the establishment of their parent organisations. The officers and staff nominated on the UDYOG MITRA should be held eligible to draw pay and allowances as admissible to them in their respective parent organisations plus special pay of 20% of basic pay per month. The Officers and staff should also be governed by the rules and regulations, including T.A. and D.A. rules of their respective parent organisations. The expenditure on account of salaries and allowances, including T.A. and D.A., should be continued to be borne by their respective parent organisations until the modalities of sharing of expenditure among the constituents of the Udyog Mitra is decided. The expenditure on office staff, advertisement, publicity, books and publications, office equipment and stationery and other related items should be incurred initially by the State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra and then shared equally by the State Level Corporations represented on the Udyog Mitra. The prerequisites like conveyance, accommodation, residential phones, etc., enjoyed by the nominee officers prior to their posting in the Udyog Mitra should be continued to be provided to them by their respective parent organisations until further orders.

8. The non-official members of the High Power Co-ordination Committee should be held eligible to draw T.A. and D.A. as are permissible to them for attending their own Board Meetings.

9. The UDYOG MITRA's office should be located on the 2nd floor of 'Nirmal', Nariman Point, Bombay, in the proximity of State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra.

10. It is necessary to draw up a strategy for common advertisement and suitable publicity to the creation and functioning of the High Power Co-ordination Committee and UDYOG MITRA, with a view to attracting the attention of the prospective entrepreneurs. For this purpose, assistance of PR Section of State Industrial and Investment

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Corporation of Maharashtra should be availed of and Shri Arvind Lavakaro, General Manager (PR) of State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra should function as advisor (PR) for the UDYOG MITRA.

11. To ensure that the UDYOG MITRA is able to speedily dispose of requests received by it, the Chief Executive Officers of the organisations concerned should be requested to provide facilities to the Convenor of the Udyog Mitra and the nominee officers to refer cases directly to them, whenever required. The nominee officers concerned should also maintain close liaison with the Special Commissioner, New Delhi, for securing early clearances from the Government of India.

12. The constituent bodies of the Udyog Mitra should consider delegation of adequate powers to their respective nominee on the UDYOG MITRA so that at least 25% of sanctions/clearances should be expeditiously given within the UDYOG MITRA itself.

13. Each Department/Corporation concerned with giving various sanctions and clearances should intimate the Udyog Mitra as soon as such sanction/clearance is given. They should also bring to its notice difficulties, if any, coming in the way of early clearances.

14. All the Departments/Corporations/Boards under various Departments of Government indicate to the Udyog Mitra the authorities to whom powers are delegated so that the Udyog Mitra representative can directly get in touch with the authority concerned, with a view to securing speedy clearance.

15. The constituent bodies of the Udyog Mitra should ensure that their nominee is constantly kept in touch with the latest changes in their policies and procedures and is also provided with up-to-date information regarding availability of facilities/assistance to new industrial units.

16. It should be the constant endeavour of the Udyog Mitra to secure the necessary sanctions/clearances from various Corporations/Boards/Departments concerned as expeditiously as possible. Towards this end, the maximum time limit within which the various facilities assistance should be secured for the entrepreneurs is indicated in the Annexure to this Resolution.

17. All Departments of Government should issue immediate instructions to all the Heads of Departments/Offices/Corporations/Boards under their administrative control that they should extend maximum cooperation and assign top priority to the references received from the Udyog Mitra in the matter of sanctions and clearances with which they are respectively concerned.

18. This Resolution issues with the concurrence of the General Administration Department.
