Role of the Divisional Commissioners  
in Industrial Development.

PREAMBLE:

The Government vide its Resolution of 14th November 1975 had constituted Regional Level Coordination Committee in the territorial jurisdiction of each of the Regional Development Corporations with a view to achieving better coordination and providing all possible assistance to the entrepreneurs at the regional level. The Government has also vide its Resolution of the 10th April 1980 designated the Divisional Commissioners as ex-officio additional Development Commissioners and in the capacity has placed on them the responsibility for monitoring various Plan Schemes and tackling general coordination problems. The question of involving the Divisional Commissioners in the process of Industrial Development of the State has been under consideration of Government for some time past.

2. Accelerating the pace of industrial development of the State, especially its developing regions is very important. The Government has constituted, at the district level "Zilla Udyog Mitra" under the Chairmanship of Collector of the District to provide a forum where the entrepreneurs can get appropriate guidance and speedy assistance and also where certain inter-departmental problems can be resolved. At the State Level, the 'Udyog Mitra' is of the forum where the general policy issues impinging on the working of more than one Department can be taken up and resolved. The Government has been considering creation of a suitable forum at the Divisional Level where the inter-departmental issues which may often retard speedy industrialisation could be taken up and resolved.

RESOLUTION-- In supersession of instructions and guidelines laid down in Government Resolution, Industries, Energy and Labour Department No. MSC 1075/IND-10 dated 14.11.1975, Government is pleased to reconstitute at each Divisional Level, the Co-ordination Committee under the Chairmanship of Divisional Commissioner consisting of the following officers :-

2. Secretarial Assistance to these Divisional Committee should be provided by the concerned Regional Development Corporation.

3. The Chairman of the Committee may also invite from time to time any other officer/s of the concerned Departments, Corporations, Boards or Banks under the control of State Government or the Government of India.

4. The Divisional Level Coordination Committee (DLCC) should set aside some time to meet with representatives of Industries Associations immediately before or after its meetings.

5. The Divisional Level Coordination Committee (DLCC) should as far as possible, meet atleast once in a quarter.

6. The functions of the Committee should generally be as follows :-

- i) to deal with problems and issues referred to it by the District Advisory Committee and ZUM in the respective revenue division.
- ii) to coordinate and review the activities of the various Corporations and other agencies concerned with Industrial Development at the divisional level including the District Industries Centres.
- iii) to review the general progress of industrialisation, identify problem areas and emerging issues and give guidelines for planning for future needs according to the potentialities of the Division.
- iv) to collect and disseminate information regarding activities of the State Level Corporations in the division.
- v) to assist entrepreneurs in getting the various permissions, facilities and incentives from Government, Corporations, Boards and local authorities expeditiously.
- vi) to take a review of sick industries and guide them suitably.

6. The State Level Corporations/Boards should forward to the respective Regional Development Corporation a schedule of the existing powers delegated to their Regional Officers and forward copies thereof to this Department immediately. Government also desires that the State Level Corporation/s should delegate further powers/authority to their regional officers so as to enable the Divisional Level Coordination Committee to arrive at quick decisions. Such adequate delegation of powers to the Regional Officers will assist in decisions being taken promptly and in a coordinated manner by the Divisional Committees. The State Level Corporations/Boards under the administrative control of this Department should communicate to the respective Regional Development Corporations their schedule of further delegation of powers/authority to their regional officers before the 15th November 1987 and send copies of such further delegation of powers to this Department.

7. The Managing Directors of Regional Development Corporations should send to this Department a quarterly report of activities as far as their regions are concerned before the 10th of the next month of the quarter under report.
